

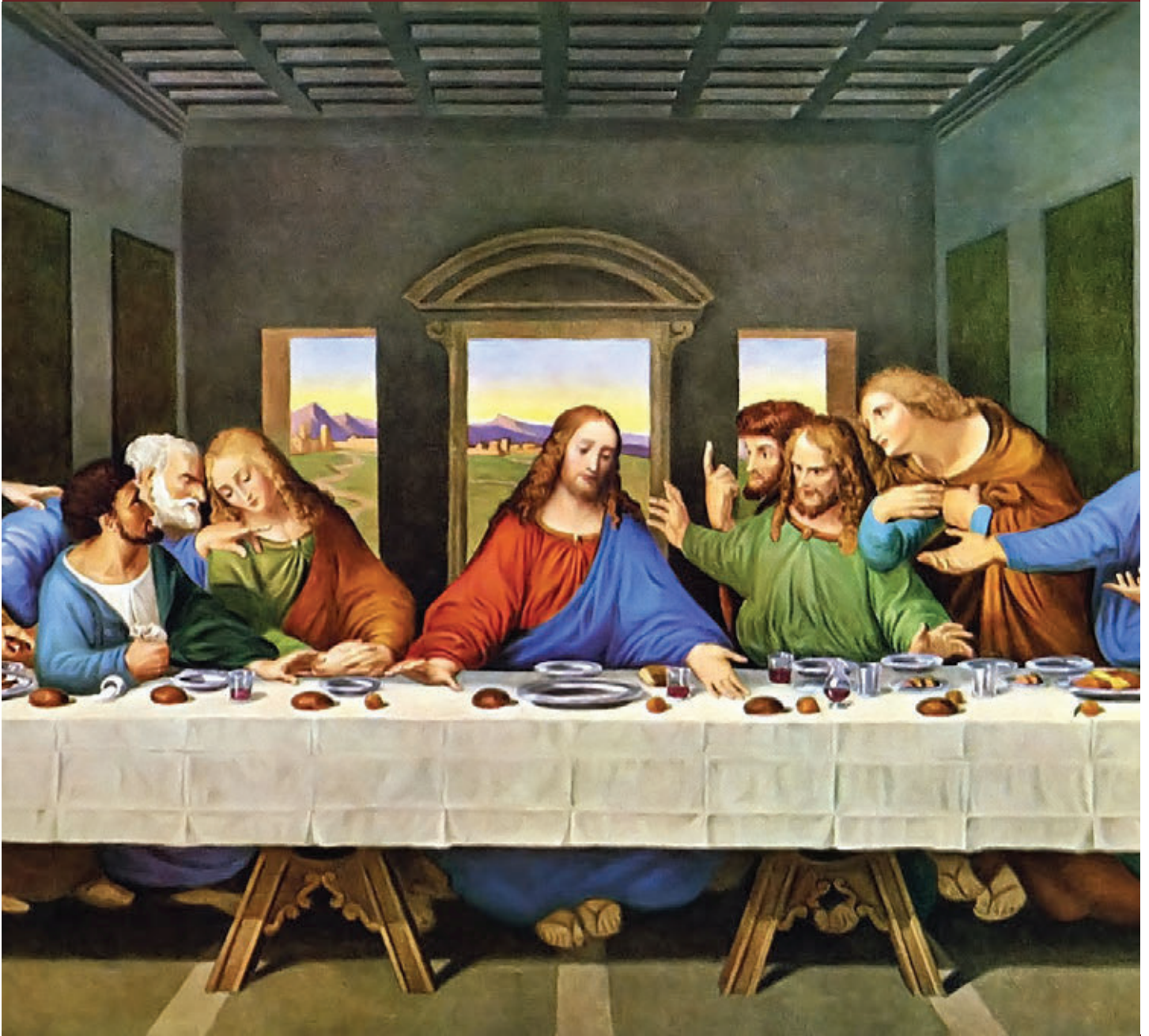

NIC NOTES

Dear Parishioners,

The CDC and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have lifted many of the Coronavirus restrictions and mandates. Since the beginning, we have followed the CDC and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania guidelines to maintain the well-being, safety and health of all of our parishioners. According to past guidelines/regulations we followed the directives of mask wearing, social distancing and capacity limits. Just as we followed the guidelines/regulations in the past, we will continue to follow the guidelines that CDC and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have given to us now.

If you have been **fully** vaccinated for Covid-19, you need not wear a mask indoors. If you have **not been** vaccinated at all for Covid-19 you need to wear a mask. Since May 31, one does not need to be socially distant in the Church or the Chapel. The Church and Chapel began on June 1 to be at 100% capacities. These are the directives given by the CDC and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Since last Tuesday, June 1, our daily Masses have been in the Chapel. Many of our Parish Ministries, Committees, and Organizations are once again reserving spaces in our Convent and Education Center for the summer and the next academic year. We are moving forward and following all the regulations, mandates, guidelines etc. given to us by the CDC and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We will continue to follow all and/or any new guidelines/regulations.

Just as in the past when you had done “firsts” several months after the Coronavirus Pandemic began and you felt a little ill at ease/strange/nervous/anxious, it will be the same with these new “firsts”. You may feel a little nervous when you see people without masks on or not socially distant or more people in a place, realize that that is normal. As a rule, our Church other than Christmas or Easter is really never more than 50 to 60% seating capacity. As a rule, our Chapel is really never more than 50 to 60% seating capacity. However, when you go into the Church or Chapel the first few times after having people always wearing masks and being socially distant with every other pew roped off and it’s now different you are going to feel a little ill at ease/strange/nervous/anxious. As you continue to do this, you will become more and more comfortable. You can always opt to wear a mask if you wish.

Let us continue to move forward to normal.

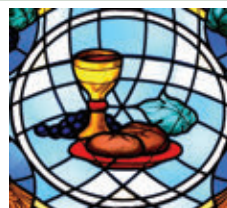

Join your parish's **Respect Life Ministry**. Begin or join a **Respect Life Group** at your school. **Donate** baby clothes, formula and disposable diapers to your local Crisis Pregnancy Center. Put a **respect life bumper sticker** on your vehicle.

Wear a **“precious feet pin”** on your backpack or collar—it's a great introduction to defend the unborn. Say the **Spiritual Adoption Prayer** with great fervor. Introduce at least one friend to the prayer. Next time you hear of someone's pregnancy, **be reaffirming** and give constructive support to God's gift of new life. **Pray** at an abortion clinic. **Fast** one day a month for an end to all threats to human life. **Pray a Rosary or a Novena** for an end to all threats to human life. **Pray** for our political leaders, that they may have the courage to protect life. Take every possible opportunity to **speak up** for the unborn, the handicapped and the elderly who are unable to defend themselves.

KEN'S CACHE

This week we summarize the material presented over the
past several weeks concerning The Sacrament of Marriage
as presented in the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENTS

God is the author of marriage.

“The matrimonial covenant by which a man and a
woman establish between themselves a partnership
of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward
the good of the spouses and the procreation and
education of offspring; this covenant between
baptized persons has been raised by Christ the
Lord to the dignity of a sacrament” (CCC, no.
1601; see CIC, can. 1055; CCEO, can 776).

Marriage is a liturgical act, appropriately held in a
public liturgy at church. By their marriage, the
couple witnesses Christ’s spousal love for the
Church.

In the Latin Church, the spouses, as ministers of
Christ’s grace, mutually confer upon each other
the Sacrament of Matrimony by expressing their
consent before the Church. The free consent of
the couple is at the heart of the marriage
celebration.

Unity, permanent lifelong commitment, and openness
to having and caring for children are essential to
marriage.

The remarriage of persons divorced from a living,
lawful spouse is not permitted by God’s law as
taught by Christ. They remain members of the
Church but cannot receive Holy Communion.
They are called and encouraged to lead Christian
lives by attending Sunday Mass and participating
as far as possible in the life of the parish and to
bring up their children in the faith.

“The Christian home is the place where the children
receive the first proclamation of the faith. For this
reason the family is rightly called ‘the domestic
church,’ a community of grace and prayer,
a school of human virtues and of Christian
charity” (CCC, no. 1666). More to come next
week.

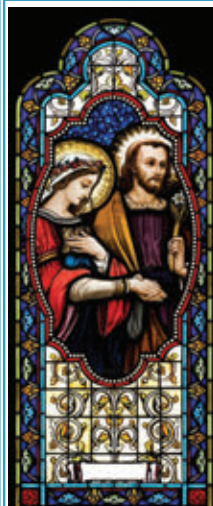

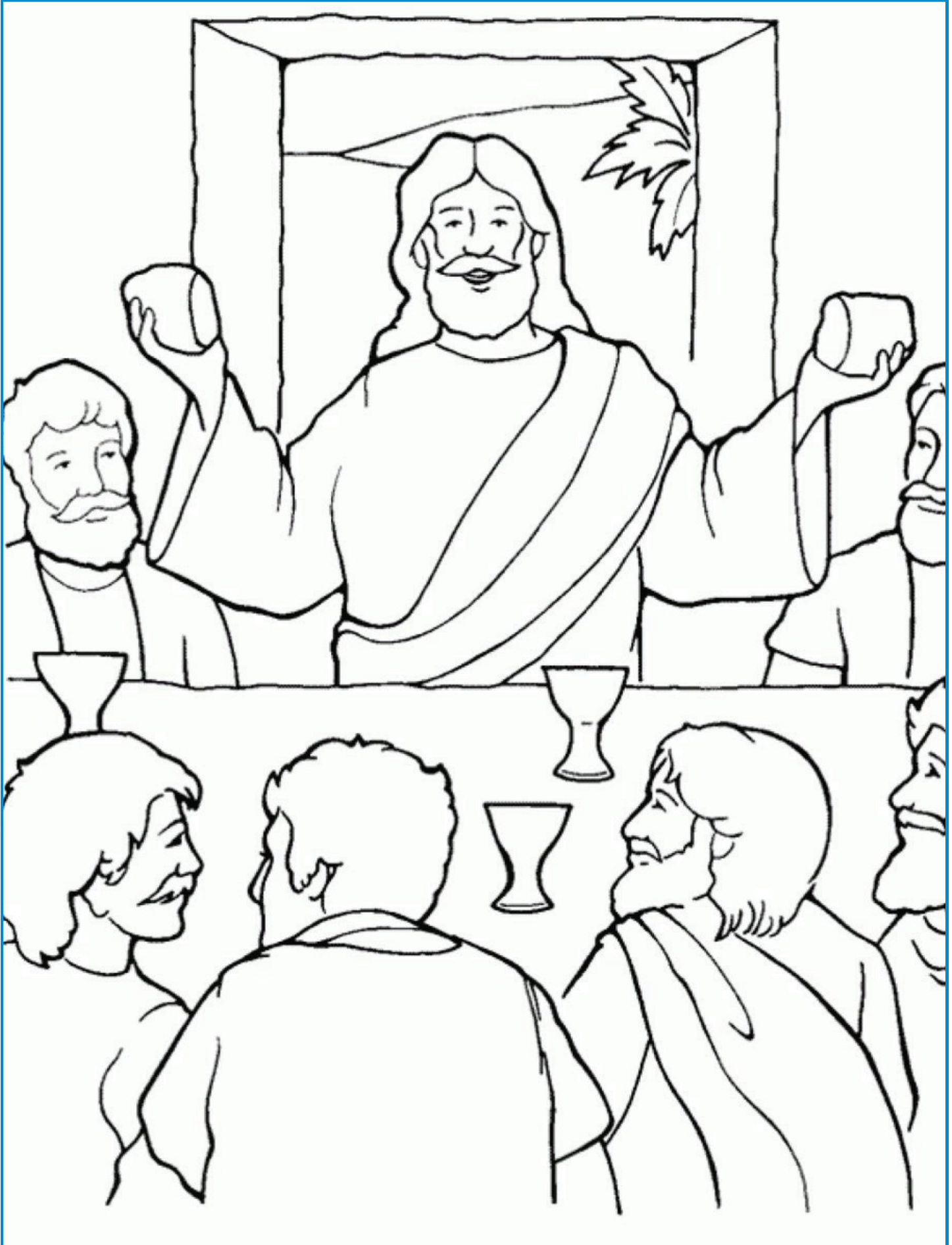


HISTORY CAME ALIVE IN MRS. VENEZIA'S CLASSROOM!
