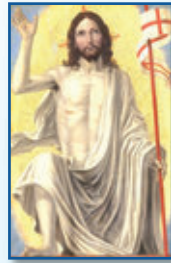

KEN'S CACHE

Early in August of this year, I accepted a part-time position with a medical courier firm delivering medicines to men with prostate cancer. It involves accepting medicines from a urology provider and delivering them to patients of that firm. I cover the Southeastern part of Pennsylvania so on some days it involves quite a few miles. In spite of that I find the work to be very fulfilling spiritually because I can spend time with the patients as I give them their medicines.

One of the most fulfilling experiences happened last week in a small town in Delaware County. It was my first visit to this African American family. I was met at the door by the patient's wife who asked if I could come in to talk to her husband. He was happy to talk to me even though he was skin and bones and hardly able to hold his head up. He was obviously at a late stage in his cancer struggle. His wife asked if I would pray with them since I announced that I was a retired minister and would routinely pray for them. She then told me that she had just had brain surgery and she also needed prayers. As we held hands and prayed, I felt the power of African American prayer. Each time I prayed that God would send graces to strengthen them to carry on, they would utter from the depths of their souls a profound "Amen". I haven't felt the power of prayer quite so deep in my being as I did that afternoon. All this from a couple who are experiencing depressingly degrading health conditions. God touched me in a profound way and strengthened my vocation to bring His Good News to any and all I encounter. I pray that you too can feel His presence in your faith journeys and feel empowered to answer Him from the depths of your soul, "Amen".

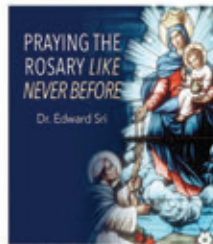

THE BROTHER HOUSE

At this time, they are in need of slightly used backpacks and duffel bags. They are always in need of newly purchased men's underwear, socks, and slightly used clothing. THE PATRICIAN SOCIETY

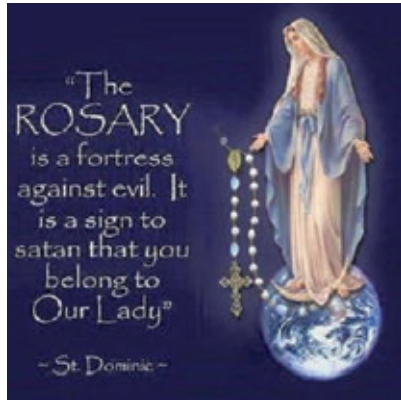

RESPECT LIFE MONTH 2021 | REFLECTION

St. Joseph: Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph”... As Pope Francis

highlights, “God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child” (PC 5).

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, “in every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’” (PC 3). His “yes” to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and

Jesus before his own. Joseph’s devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life.

Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.
