**NIC NOTES**

Dear Parishioners,

Do you remember the forty hours that Our Lord spent in the tomb after His Passion and Death? At the end of those forty hours, Jesus rose from that tomb in glory, conquering sin and death once and for all.

Do you remember the forty days after Easter that Our Lord spent with His Apostles? After those forty days, Jesus ascended to the Father to prepare a place for us in Heaven. So, during the Forty Hours Devotion, we should try to become one with the two Scriptural events just mentioned, walk with Our Divine Lord and be with Him in prayer and meditation. Notice that after every cycle of forty, something beautiful and significant happens. It is our prayer as our parish makes the Forty Hours, that we too, will experience something beautiful; that whatever intentions you bring on these days to Our Eucharistic Lord will be answered, and that you as well will experience the “good things of the Lord.”

THE FORTY HOURS IS A TIME OF OPPORTUNITY

Some member of every family...your family should participate in the Forty Hours Devotion. Whatever sacrifices are involved, make them. You can be sure that God will bless you for making them. Remember that the heart of the Forty Hours Devotion is the **HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS**. Attend Mass during the Forty Hours. Receive the Holy Eucharist. Take advantage of every chance the Forty Hours offers you to become a better person, a better Christian, and a better Catholic. Make the Forty Hours a little mini-retreat for yourself! Make up your mind to make the Forty Hours meaningful for you.

DURING THE FORTY HOURS

It is sad to realize that so many people do not believe that Jesus is present in the Blessed Sacrament and seldom visit Him. People travel across oceans to see ancient ruins, paintings, landscapes and celebrities, but they do not think of going into a local church around the corner to visit the CREATOR of all beauty. We complain about tensions, frustrations and hang-ups. For these human weaknesses, we consume bottles of pills and other remedies. We spend time and money to find out who we are and how we came to be. We are often tormented by our past and entertain visions of grandeur or despair of the future. We have a need to simply empty ourselves, know ourselves, accept ourselves and rise above ourselves. To whom should we go when no one listens or cares to hear our tale of woe? Who beckons to our broken hearts or gives us the opportunity to cry without shame? The answer is Jesus, present in the Blessed Sacrament!

As the rays of the sun change whatever they touch, so the Eternal Son, Jesus, present in the Blessed Sacrament changes whomever places himself or herself in His presence. As we begin our parish celebration of Forty Hours when Jesus will be present, exposed in the monstrance on the altar for three days, He beckons you. “Come to me all who are burdened and I will refresh you. Watch and pray with Me.”

ADORATION

Throughout the three days of our Solemn Annual Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, you will have the graced opportunity to

spend some “quiet time” with Jesus. Jesus waits for you here on the altar. He, who not only humbled Himself to come among us as a man, but in the Eucharist-further humbles Himself by coming to us under the frail appearance of Bread! Here is truly a God who loves us. Refer to the schedule for the times of Adoration. The Church will be open! He waits for you!

What should you do during your time of Adoration? Bring your Bible and read significant passages from Sacred Scripture, especially the sixth chapter of the Gospel of Saint John. There will be adoration booklets available for you in the Church to help guide you in your prayer. You may wish to say the Holy Rosary. Perhaps, you might want to just “sit down” in His Presence. Come and “be” in the presence of your Lord God and Brother Jesus. When you begin your hour of Adoration, make it for a special intention - perhaps you may want to offer your hour for a son or daughter who is having problems, or who has been away from the Church, for peace, for good health, et cetera. Whatever it is, the Lord is there to listen to you.

May God, through the intercession of Saint Helena, bless us!

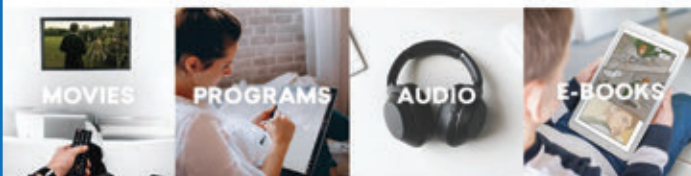

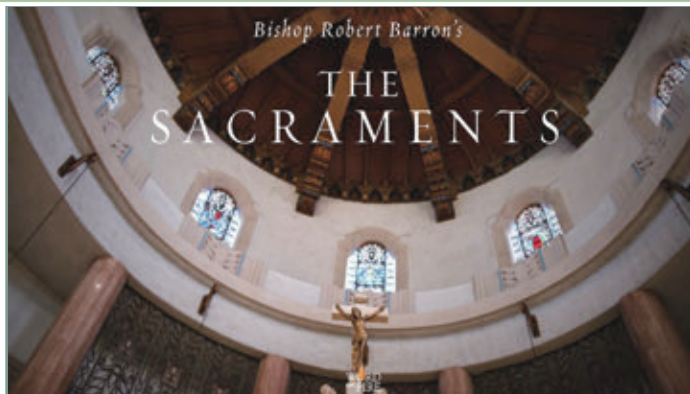

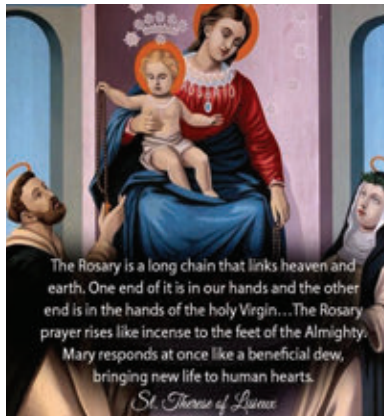

KEN'S CACHE

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished! Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother, a mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law."

To those who were learning to regard Jesus as the Messiah, the Anointed One of God, these words would come as a bleak shock.

They regarded the Messiah as conqueror and King, and the Messianic age as a golden time. In Jewish thought, fire is almost always the symbol of *judgement*. So, then, Jesus regarded the coming of His Kingdom as a time of judgement. The Jews firmly believed that God would judge other nations by one standard and themselves by another; that the very fact that a man was a Jew would be enough to absolve him. However, much we may wish to eliminate the element of judgment from the message of Jesus, it remains stubbornly and unalterably there.

So, Jesus' coming would inevitably mean division; in point of fact it did. That was one of the great reasons why the Romans hated Christianity – it tore families in two. Over and over again, a man had to decide whether he loved better his kith and kin or Christ. The essence of Christianity is that loyalty to Christ has to take precedence over dearest loyalties of this earth. A man must be prepared to count all things but loss for the excellence of Jesus Christ. Jesus goes on to say in further chapters that the real issue to be stressed is the cost of not regarding the importance of time. The judgement is coming and we must be ready or face the consequences of the judgement.

As we regard the symptoms of the breakdown in family structure today; I'm not talking about the tragedy single family households only, but just as tragic, the emptiness and loneliness in families where both parents work and children fend for themselves by playing in sports, or other extracurricular activities, resulting in little time for important family events such as eating together or going to church together.

Have we taken the time to reckon on the consequences of these actions on the stability of the family.

Unfortunately, the pressures associated with having possessions and attaining status can become the idols that push God out of our lives to our ultimate rejection by our Lord at the judgement.

Jesus came to alert us to these possibilities and suffered ultimate humiliation at the hands of his detractors just so that he could open the possibility of our overcoming our denial of Jesus and his message. To deny this reality to us and those we love is the ultimate sin. Let your current judgement about your life and those you love precede the final judgement of the Lord.

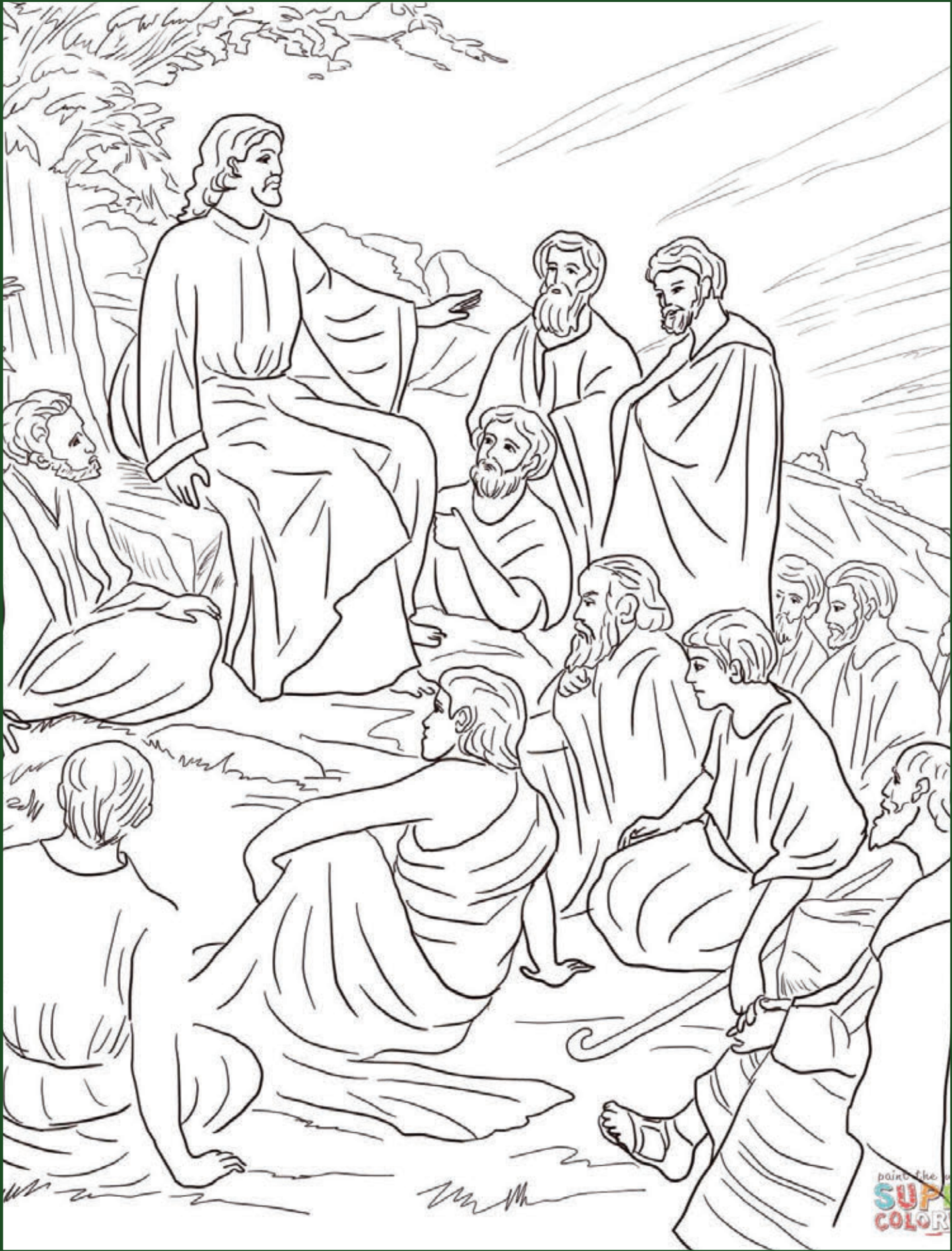

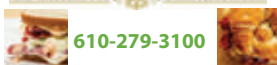

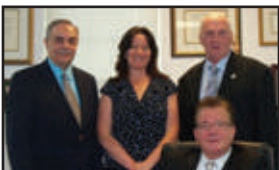
