Most of all, let us continue to pray for each other and for all the people affected by this virus.

There is a mysterious beauty in the ability to watch, pray, and participate together at home with your families in the various resources we will be providing during this trying time. Please know that other families will be doing the same, and this will be the way we keep the Parish Family of Saint Helena together in prayer.

- 1) Daily Mass to be offered via the Chapel livestream at 10:00 AM
- 2) A Saturday evening Vigil Mass to be offered via the Church livestream at 4:00 PM
- 3) A Sunday Mass to be offered via the Church livestream at 10:00 AM
- 4) Confessions will still be heard at 2:00 PM in the Church
- 5) The Chapel will be open daily for private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament from 11:00 AM until 7:30 PM Monday to Friday; and Saturday and Sunday from 11:00 AM until 5:00 PM

Please do not come to visit the Chapel if you are not feeling well.

- 6) We have numerous prayers and devotions available on our website,

including the Stations of the Cross, Divine Mercy Chaplet, the Rosary, and others.

- 7) The Parish office is closed to the public, but staff members will be here to answer your calls Monday to Friday, from 9AM to 5PM.

In this time when everyone is making sacrifices, and being affected economically from the environment created by the regulations we must all rightfully adhere to, it seems strange to point out that without Sunday Mass, there is no Sunday collection, which is vital for the running of our Parish. All of you have been so generous in supporting your Parish and building it up into the wonderful worship community that it is. This Parish IS the center of our lives. It is important for all of us to continue to support Saint Helena. We kindly ask you to please either sign up to give your offering through Parish Giving or mail in your offering donations to the
