# **EUCHARIST EXPOSITION AND BENEDICTION WITH EVENING PRAYER**

**Presider:** O God, come to my assistance.

Congregation: O Lord, make haste to help us.

All: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the Beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen

**EXPOSITION:** The following is sung as the presider exposes the Blessed Sacrament.

Our foes press on from ev'ry side;
Your aid supply, your strength bestow.

2. To your great name be endless praise, Immortal Godhead, One in Three; Grant us, for endless length of days, In our true native land to be. Amen

After exposition, the sacrament is incensed.

**EVENING PRAYER:** The responses will be antiphonal. The first response will be on the right side of the church and will alternate thereafter.

# **ANTIPHON 1**

Leader: God has appointed Christ to be judge of the living and the dead.

Response: (right side) The Lord's revelation to my Master:

"Sit on my right:

your foes I will put beneath my feet."

(left side) The Lord will wield from Zion

your scepter of power: rule in the midst of all your foes.

(rs) A prince from the day of your birth

on the holy mountains;

from the womb before the dawn I begot you.

- (ls) The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change.
  "You are a priest for ever,
  a priest like Melchizedek of old."
- (rs) The Master standing at your right hand will shatter kings in the day of his great wrath.
- (ls) He shall drink from the stream by the wayside and therefore he shall lift up his head.
- (all) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen

**Presider:** Father, we ask you to give us victory and peace. In Jesus Christ, our Lord and King, we are already seated at your right hand. We look forward to praising you in the fellowship of all your saints in our heavenly homeland.

All: God has appointed Christ to be judge of the living and the dead.

# **ANTIPHON 2**

- Response: (rs) Happy the man who fears the Lord who takes delight in all his commands. His sons will be powerful on earth; the children of the upright are blessed.
  - (ls) Riches and wealth are in his house; his justice stands firm forever.

    He is light in the darkness for the upright. he is generous, merciful and kind.
  - (rs) The good man takes pity and lends, he conducts his affairs with honor.

    The just man will never waver: he will be remembered forever.
  - (Is) He has no fear of evil news; with a firm heart he trusts in the Lord. With a steadfast heart he will not fear; he will see the downfall of his foes.

- (rs) Open-handed, he gives to the poor; his justice stands firm forever.
  His head will be raised in glory.
- (ls) The wicked man sees and is angry, grinds his teeth and fades away; the desire of the wicked leads to doom.
- (all) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen

  - (Is) He did no wrong;
    no deceit was found in his mouth.
    When he was insulted,
    he returned no insult.
  - (rs) When he was made to suffer, he did not counter with threats.

    Instead he delivered himself up to the One who judges justly.
  - (ls) In his own body
    he brought your sins to the cross,
    so that all of us, dead to sin,
    could live in accord with God's will.
  - (rs) By his wounds you were healed.

(all) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen

# **CANTICLE OF MARY: (ALL STAND)**

Leader: Teach us to serve the needs of others,

All: and to be like you, who came to serve, not to be served.

Leader: Grant that in the human family, brother may always help brother,

All: so that, with your assistance, it may be a city compact and strong.

Leader: Have mercy on all the departed,

All: bring them to the vision of your glory.

Presider: Let us pray to the Father in the Words that Jesus gave us:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name,

Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our treaspasses,

As we forgive those who treaspass against us,

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

# **BENEDICTION:** (All kneel)

1. Down in adoration falling,
This great Sacrament we hail;
Over ancient forms of worship
Newer rites of grace prevail;
Faith will tell us Christ is present,
When our human senses fail.

2. To the everlasting Father,
And the Son who made us free,
And the Spirit, God proceeding
From them Each eternally,
Be salvation, honor, blessing,
Might and endless majesty. Amen

Presider: You have given them Bread from heaven.

All: Having all sweetness within it.

Presider: Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the eucharist as the memorial of your

suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood, help us to experience the salvation you won for us and the peace of the kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy

Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

The presider then blesses the people with the Eucharist.

The presider then reposes the blessed sacrament in the tabernacle and geneflects. The following is said during this time;

All: Blessed be God.

Blessed be his Holy Name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man.

Blessed be the Name of Jesus.

Blessed be his most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be his most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most holy.

Blessed be her holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in his angels and in his saints.

May the heart of Jesus, in the most Blessed Sacrament, be praised, adored and loved, with grateful affection, at every moment, in all the tabernacles of the world, even to the end of time. Amen.

Presider: Let us pray:

God our Father,
your Word, Jesus Christ, spoke peace to a sinful world
and brought mankind the gift of reconciliation
by the suffering and death he endured.
Teach us, the people who bear his name,
to follow the example he gave us:
may our faith, hope and charity
turn hatred to love, conflict to peace, death to eternal life.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

All: Holy God, we praise thy name; Lord of all, we bow before thee; All on earth thy scepter claim, All in heaven above adore thee. Infinite thy vast domain, Everlasting is thy reign!
